Grading Policy

- Major Grades - 60% of class grade Minor Grades - 40% of class grade

Retesting & Late Work Policy

- Students will be allowed to retest one exam per nine weeks. Students may retest for a score up to 100. Teachers may develop a more lenient policy if they or their team believe it is in the best interest of the student.
- Late work is accepted. Students who do not turn in an assignment on the due date will lose 15 points for each successive school day that the assignment is late. If an assignment is not turned in within two school days of the due date, the assignment will be scored as a zero.
